Introducing the Facelift for the Future Ministry Team

At the May Church Council meeting, the Facelift for the Future Ministry Team was created and authorized to act as a building committee for yet to be determined renovations to certain parts of our existing church facility. This group will lead and manage the overall effort of providing a substantial facelift to the church's current facilities. For several months, a variety of conversations have occurred concerning how our church facilities might be updated. This has involved members of the pastoral staff, the Stewards and the Decorating Committee among others.

While opinions vary on the exact nature and extent of updates needed, there is a growing consensus among church leaders and the congregation itself that a substantial facelift is both needed and desirable. It is generally acknowledged that our church's physical appearance and presentation can have an important impact on visitors deciding to return and possibly join the congregation; and that our current presentation might be hurting us rather than helping us.

On May 6, 2008, the Stewards invited current members of boards and committees to a presentation in the sanctuary. Architectural renderings by local architect, George Acock, of possible updates and changes to the sanctuary, lobby, front entry area, and fellowship hall were shared with the group. Financial estimates for different phases of the renovation were provided. Opportunity was given for those in attendance to share their reactions. Additional feedback was encouraged and has been received since that meeting.

At the May 20, 2008 Stewards monthly meeting, all these issues were discussed again. The prevailing consensus of those present indicated that the Stewards

are reluctant to borrow money for the purpose of renovating or updating church facilities. But they are open to using a substantial, but as of yet unspecified, percentage of the approximate \$190,000 in the capital equipment fund for these purposes.

Here's a description of the scope of the Facelift for the Future Ministry Team's responsibilities:

- a) Report to the Church Council directly and regularly.
- b) Discuss with the Stewards what amount of the capital equipment fund can be allocated for this purpose.
- c) Be empowered to raise additional funds from within the congregation for specific purposes having to do with this project.
- d) Identify the scope of the exact improvements to be made and in what sequence.
- e) Manage the budget for the overall project avoiding either the necessity of procuring a loan or exhausting the capital equipment fund.
- f) Obtain competitive bids for all work to be done and award contracts appropriately.
- g) Oversee and provide quality control for all work done.
- h) Communicate fully with the congregation before, during and after the project.

The members of the Facelift for the Future Ministry Team include four Stewards: Jeff Farquhar, Lew Ash, Arnie Penzek, and Mike Schlatter; three at large members: Sandy Brader, Jenny Metzger, JoEllen Landman; and three ex-officio members: Dick Shaw (Church Moderator), Rick Breusch (Senior Pastor) and Glenn Perry (Executive Pastor). Please pray for God's guidance and direction for this new ministry team!

Where Does My KRBC Mission Giving Go?



To help clarify some questions that have been asked, and make it easier for those recording giving in the church office, the KRBC Missions Committee (Tim Remick, Gayle Sheahan, Jennifer Whisler, Richard Smith, and Laura Hall, Chair) shares answers to these FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions):

If I mark my offering plate envelope to go to "KRBC Missions" where does it go?

Monies collected from the offering plate are used to support the ministries of a variety of individuals and missions organizations that the church membership has committed to support for the year.

How is this determined?

Each year, the missions committee after discussion, prayer, and evaluation of current giving and ministry commitments, proposes budget that is put into a final form by the Budget Committee and then voted and approved by the church membership in December for the coming year.

How do I get a list of the ministries that are budgeted?

You can request a copy from the church office, or find it in a copy of the Annual Report (available in January or February).

What happens if a new mission opportunity comes up in the middle of the year needing funding?

The mission committee has the individual(s) present their need to the committee, and after discussion we make a decision on support for the remainder of the year. Funding comes from either the Ballbach Short Term Foreign Missions Fund or the Short Term Home Missions Fund. If the opportunity will continue into the next year, it is evaluated during our annual budget discussions, and can be added for church approval for the next year. (e.g. Trumbo's opportunity to China).

How do I get information on where to send my contribution directly?

The church office is putting together a list of the ministries we currently have budgeted with addresses, account numbers (if needed), and websites for giving on-line. It will be available at the welcome center.

What if I want to give more than what the church has

budgeted for a specific missionary/ ministry?

Previously some have given through the offering plate. However, starting in mid-June we will limit this to a few missions to simplify things in the church office and help with record keeping.

Those wanting to give more than what our church has budgeted should give directly to the missionary organization. (e.g. directly to Campus Crusade for Christ to support the Metzgers with appropriate account number to direct it to their needs.)

Is giving directly to the missionary organization tax deductible?

Yes. You will receive a receipt in the mail for tax purposes.

Which ones can I still designate and put through the church offering plate?

We have decided to limit this to those we support that are not tied to an organization. They include:

Dr. Pete and Judy Obregon

Kim Brown Projects (not routinely supported by ABC national giving) — designate one of the following: The House of Blessing Day Care Center, Health Project for Tribal People, Community-Based Rehabilitation Program, The House of Love, or Current Building Project.

Specific ABC Offering (America for Christ, One Great Hour of Sharing, World Missions, or Retired Ministers and Missionaries)

Youth Mission Trip

We also have a need to replenish the Ballbach Short Term Foreign Mission Fund and Short Term Home Mission Fund to make sure we have funds as new opportunities arise, so you can designate to these also.

How do I find out what is going on with the missionaries/ministries we support?

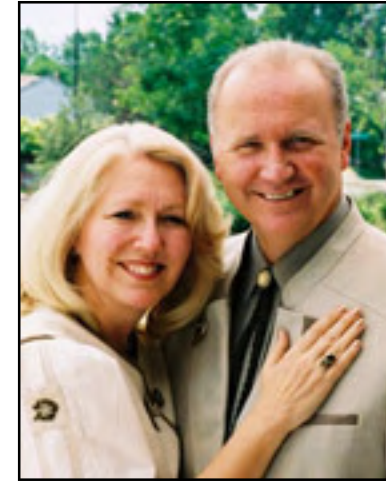
Take a few minutes to read the updates on the missions bulletin board (on the wall outside of the church lounge).

The Ubiquitous Black Chain

The whole issue of global poverty makes me real uncomfortable. We've all seen the pictures on TV, and maybe even sponsored a child through Compassion International, but I'm sure the whole situation makes you uncomfortable as well. There are many reasons why extreme poverty exists throughout the world and there are equally as many reasons why those who can are not doing much to help the problem. I believe the biggest reason why the western world is not doing more is because it is not a problem that we see on our doorstep. Enter the Black Chain.

If you've been in the church in the last month, you have undoubtedly noticed the Black Chain that wraps around the entire church...twice. It is 14,500 links long and measures $\frac{1}{2}$ mile in length. Every link in the chain represents 2 lives that will be lost today simply because they cannot afford to survive. 29,000 people die every day from lack of food or basic medication. The students of KRBC have put an arbitrary tag of \$0.25 per person to take the chain down. So at 50¢ a link it will take \$7,250 to remove the chain from the walls of KRBC. Add that to the \$900 the students raised as a part of the 30 HR. Famine which will amount to over \$8,000 raised for World Vision to fight extreme poverty in the direst locations. Donations can be made at the church in the "Bread Box", which is a blue box that sits in the lobby during the 1st service and in the back of the Fellowship Hall for the 2nd service.

I spend more time at this church than you. I see the chain every day. It is huge, it is depressing, it is everywhere. As I was obtaining permission from the Stewards for the project, Jeff Farquhar asked me where it was going to be hung. I told him it would be hung everywhere, the chain was ubiquitous. It falls down and blocks doorways and drinking fountains and has to be rehung. When it obstructs a classroom or an office, it is usually kicked aside until someone will come and tape it back on the wall. The black chain has become a nuisance. What started off as a powerful visual statement has become somewhat annoying. *Lord, may we never view those whom you love and created and who are suffering as bothersome. And may our reaction never be to simply kick the distraction aside so that it is "out of our way" but may we see Your people as You see them - with eyes and hearts of compassion.*

It is *our* problem, it is *your* problem. Our efforts are a drop in the bucket of a global effort but with our donations, World Vision will be able to provide 8,000 days of food for children who are hungry.

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering Myanmar Relief Efforts

On February 19, 1812, Adoniram Judson and his new bride, Ann, set sail for India to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. The Judsons were not allowed entrance into India by the East India Company, so they turned their eyes towards Burma. And thus, a Baptist legacy of sending the good news to the people of Burma (and around the world) began.



It took six years for the Judsons to convert a single Burmese citizen to Christianity, but Adoniram and

Ann Judson continued to serve the Lord faithfully in Burma for 38 years, and upon Adoniram's death there were roughly 210,000 Burmese Christians.

Today, the Burmese community (now known as Myanmar) is facing unfathomable conditions due to the recent destruction of cyclone Nargis. The death toll in Myanmar is up to 134,000 and damage has posed a threat to the continuing existence of the communities. ABC International Ministries states that, "Cyclone Nargis destroyed the greatest rice producing fields and the animals used in agricultural work, leaving thousands with no hope for food for the next year. Furthermore, fishing, a major source of food, is not being done...locals refuse to continue fishery from the contaminated water."

The Christian community in Burma has also been limited in its ability to provide for its surrounding communities. The Myanmar Baptist Convention has lost more than 10,000 members and nearly 94,000 members have lost their homes.

In light of the devastation in Burma, and the Baptist legacy that lives there, the missions committee of Karl Road Baptist church has decided to work in connection with ABC Ohio to have the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering be directed to support relief efforts in Myanmar.

The One Great Hour of Sharing Offering goal for 2008 is \$3,500 and collection will begin in the month of July. Please pray for the people of Burma and consider giving to the relief efforts.
