New and Improved Web Site!

The KRBC web site (www.karlroadbaptist.org) has been redesigned and updated by Cory Baugher, Web Administrator. Bill Lonborg, Information Technology guru ("the IT guy") provided security and network support. The new site is more user friendly and can be edited from any computer anywhere. Each ministry leader will now be in charge of maintaining their own web page and keeping it up-to-date. For example, Nikki Fisher has the ability to login to the site and edit the Mother's Day Out page while Aimee Worley can login and edit the youth, outreach, and mission pages. Kari Lashley will still be responsible for a lot of the information on the website such as special events while Cory will be maintaining the site and overseeing the updates. The church calendar has to be updated by Bill Lonborg.

Another cool feature about the website is the messages page. Here you can download the audio files of the messages and find an online player for each message. This allows you to listen to the message streaming without having to download it first. Eric Kleinpaste has been a big help with converting the audio from Sunday morning worship service to an MP3 format to be uploaded to the site each week.

The church calendar is another nice addition. You can now view a full monthly calendar and, on the right side of the site, there is a module that lets you see the five most recent upcoming events. You can also download all our church forms and do online registration for many of the forms that our church offers.

As I lay in the mud with a slight rain coming down, another angel appeared to hold my hand and comfort me as I waited. She volunteered to call my wife to let her know what was happening and where I was to be taken. She called my wife again a couple days later to see if I was alright.

During my stay in the hospital, where I was recovering from two surgeries to repair my right leg, many angels waited on me. They looked like nurses and aides and cleaning people to most people, but to me they were ministering angels, comforting me when I couldn't sleep and cheering when I felt bad.

As I recover at home, I feel God's healing hand on me every day. He watches over my family and will bring us through this test stronger in body and faith.

I believe God used me to stop that driver before she could get farther down the road where she could have inflicted even greater damage and injury on some unsaved person or family. No one will know, but that is my belief. God has saved me from what could have been far greater injuries or even death. He saved me for service to him in a capacity that will bring glory to God and his church.



My Testimony

I believe in angels. I believe God directs my path in ways perplexing to me, but aimed to bring glory to him and his church.

God started me on a journey in May of 2008 when I was released from my job after 18 years. While I looked for a new job, he kept my family safe and secure. In August, God gave me a temporary job in Groveport, a second shift job that had me driving home at 12:30 in the morning. It wasn't much of a job, but it was good honest work and kept my days free to look for more rewarding work.

On December 9, I went to work as usual. At 12:30 on December 10, I clocked out and left for home. I was driving north on I-270 thinking about the welcoming Christmas lights at my house and how I needed to get a haircut the next day.

As I approached the route 62 exit at Gahanna, I noticed headlights coming down the exit ramp, going the wrong way. I moved to the far left lane, hoping that whoever was in the car would pass to my right. There was plenty of room over there. It was not God's will. The car continued toward me and we crashed head-on.

My car spun around and came to rest facing on-coming traffic with no lights. God stretched out his mighty hand to protect me, wrapping his mighty arms around me, saving me from serious injury. One car sped by on my left, then another came right at me. All I could do was say "No! No!" as the car kept coming toward me. I heard the skidding tires and I braced for impact, but God stopped the car less than one foot from me. An eye witness reported that he saw the car collide with my stalled vehicle.

I decided I would be safer out of the car. My door was jammed shut, so I crawled to the passenger side and opened the door. As I tried to get out, two angels appeared and helped me, carrying me to the median of the highway to await the ambulance. One of the angels just happened to be an EMT for a volunteer fire department.


