Through a partnership with Campus Crusade for Christ (Cru), King's Domain, located near Cincinnati, seeks to combine multiple types of ministry opportunities—camp, college, youth, urban, children's—to prepare students for the college campus and beyond. Throughout the course of the summer—especially during training weeks—the schedule includes teaching from a variety of renowned speakers. Students are discipled, dig into the Word together, learn how to facilitate a Bible study, attend a local church, participate in small groups and pour into their peers.]

We have around 10 (so far) youth and 4 leaders going on the King's Domain mission project this summer. We leave on July 15 and each day at camp will be serving/leading young children through their camp experience. In the evenings we get our own "camp" time with lots of good teaching and fun time together. It is going to be an awesome week.

Thanks to your regular missions giving we are able to fund some of this project through our summer mission account – thanks! The balance of the cost for each person is \$120. Many of the youth are willing to work to earn that \$120. Could you hire one of them for a couple of hours work? They are available for mowing, mulching, shopping, cleaning, babysitting, typing, gardening, and other things. The fee is \$10/hour. Here are the steps to follow if you would like to hire someone:

1. Email me aworley@karlroadbaptist.org with some information about the job you have available.
2. Wait for the young person to call you to make arrangements for time and location.
3. Sign the young person's time sheet when they come to work for you.
4. Submit to me – Aimee Worley - a check made out to KRBC with King's Domain in the memo in the amount that you owe for the work performed.

The youth are out of school now and available during the day as well as evenings and weekends.
