

Introducing Our New Worship and Music Director

Ken Powell spent the first few years of his life in Nigeria where his parents served with Wycliffe Bible Translators. The family settled in Eastern Kentucky where Ken studied piano and trombone as he grew up. A summer spent at the University of Kentucky's music training program was one of the formative experiences that solidified his desire to use his musical gifts for Christ.

Ken earned a degree in music composition at Moody Bible Institute in Chicago. He and Sally, a vocal performance major, met there and stayed in the Chicago area as newlyweds. Ken worked for Moody, for Calvary Memorial Church in Oak Park, and then for First Baptist Church of Downers Grove during those early years, while Sally sang professionally with the Chicago Symphony Chorus.

Later, as they welcomed their first son, Joshua, Ken and Sally were called to a full time worship pastorate role at South Baptist Church in Lansing, MI. SBC was a large, vibrant congregation with both traditional and contemporary worship formats. The annual Christmas productions were a significant affair with live animals, extensive pageantry and multiple weekends of performances.

Ken has always had a strong interest in music technology and digital recording. During his collegiate training and in his early years of ministry, Ken began to explore opportunities to work professionally in fields related to those areas of interest. Having worked for a video editing firm in Chicago, Ken applied his knowledge to help churches improve their video presentation systems and audio systems. Ken launched his own video editing company after his time with South Baptist and enjoyed working alongside ministries, missionaries and businesses to produce promotional and training videos. Working with churches on video projects lead to his involvement with Grace Bible Church of Ann Arbor, MI. While assisting GBC with a new video projection system installation, the church pastor offered Ken the opportunity to join him in ministry. Ken's involvement with Grace Bible Church was focused in large part on helping the church transition from a more traditional worship style to a blended worship style.

After several wonderful years in Michigan, Ken was called back to First Baptist Church of Downers Grove, Illinois, to serve as Associate Pastor of Worship and Adult Ministries. Ken's return to FBCDG allowed for extensive managerial oversight, teacher training and ministry programming. God continued to grow his desire to assist churches and nonprofit organizations with their media and technology needs. This desire was eventually met through a position with Church Multimedia, doing system design, installation and training in churches across the nation.

Ken worked with Church Multimedia and later branched into live production for a company called Visible Display. Although the time spent working with major concert events around the country was thrilling, the extensive travel began to take its toll. In 2012 Ken began looking for work in his field that would allow for more family time. This pursuit brought Ken to Columbus to work for Live Technologies as an account executive in the House of Worship division.

Ken and Sally have been praying for some time that God would lead them to a church where he could once again serve in worship ministry. According to Ken, "God has provided wonderfully for me (and my family) by paving the way for us to become a part of the Karl Road Baptist Church family. We have seen his hand so evident throughout the whole process. We are thrilled to serve in this capacity and look forward to all that God has planned for KRBC."

Ken and Sally have two boys, Joshua (15) and Clayton (10) that love to play golf with their Dad. Josh plays guitar and loves basketball. He has spent several years in the Civil Air Patrol and is the Cadet Commander for his squadron. Clayton loves horses and plays the banjo.

Sally has been Adjunct Faculty at Bryan College since 2008. She is the founding Director of the Bryan College Community Youth Choir. She is involved locally and nationally with several music teacher associations. Sally has served faithfully at their local church in Tennessee, leading worship services on a regular basis.

Emerson and Ivy Wu Move Closer to Commissioning

Emerson and Ivy Wu, American Baptist International Ministries (IM) endorsed candidates, reached an important milestone on April 1 by being appointed for service as development workers in Macau, a special administrative region of China.

The Wus will work in partnership with the Macau Bible Institute. They will assist in the training of Christian young workers of the Institute. In partnership with Evangelize China Fellowship International (ECF), they will assist the ministries of the Grace Community Chapel and Orphanage and youth outreach in Macau. They will also help to promote ECF and IM's work with relations in Mainland China.

The Wus were first endorsed by IM to form a Partnership Team (MPT). Assisted by their MPT and IM staff, the couple then began building a Partnership Network (MPN) to secure commitments of prayer and financial support from individuals and churches. Having built a network sufficient for an initial level of support, Emerson and Ivy moved from endorsement to development worker appointment.

Upon appointment, development workers become IM employees. This allows the Wus to complete cross-cultural orientation, security and other pre-field training to prepare them for international, cross-cultural ministry. Appointment also frees them to expand their MPN to secure the remaining personalized support needed to be commissioned by the IM Board for missionary service.

When asked why they believe they have been called by God to this ministry, Ivy responded, "The Lord uses the hunger in my heart for His Word to feed others wherever there is spiritual hunger." Emerson added, "He keeps opening doors for us to serve the Chinese community. God's direction guides us to see His leading in being a part of His great commission. That is why we firmly step up to IM's mission."

"The American Baptist Churches of Ohio is blessed to recognize and support Emerson and Ivy for service in China under the auspices of IM," commented Dr. Lawrence O. Swain, ABC/Ohio Executive Minister. "The Wus are active members of the Karl Road Baptist Church in Columbus where their gifts are both recognized and used in the church's ministry. Emerson and Ivy have demonstrated faithfulness in their Christian life, and a clear sense of God's call and giftedness for missionary service. The Wu's will become another mission couple that ABC/Ohio will be proud to call 'their own.'" Dr. Swain added. "I am pleased to lend my blessing and support to the Wus as they develop their Partnership Team."

Life Skills Classes

Volunteers needed for transportation.

The past three months have brought a huge learning curve for those who have worked together to begin the Life Skills ministry to recent immigrants and refugees. The group had worked with World Relief staff from September to January—planning curriculum, putting out flyers and preparing information highly relevant to families new to our culture.

Beginning in January 2013, a series of three classes each on finances and smart shopping practices, healthy cooking skills and child development were shared with families from Congo and Nepal.

The result of all the prayer and preparation was that those teaching learned many important lessons, which will be valuable in developing our effort to reach out to those who are struggling as they adjust to a new home. Students' needs caused some lessons to be set aside. Speaking Swahili to a French-speaking audience brought some adjustments. The weekly difficulty in providing transportation for large families was a huge hurdle to overcome.

Life Skills classes will continue through the summer with computer training and conversation partners. **There is a great need for volunteers to provide transportation for the Congolese families from the neighborhood to these classes at our church.** Will you pray about becoming a part of this ministry? Classes will meet at 7 p.m. each Wednesday through August.
