The ministry of Daily Audio Bible has experienced phenomenal growth in the past seven years going from zero to more than 60,000 listeners who download Brian's daily reading of scripture and comments. If one listens every day, you will get through the entire Bible in one year. Daily Audio Bible listeners come from all walks of life. They make up a globally, culturally and denominationally diverse group of people listening to the Word everyday with the goal of getting through the Bible in a year. Brian appears to be a sincere Christian leader who wants to partner with local churches to reach people for Jesus. His bottom line aim is to make the Bible the hero - shining light on the transformational power of Scripture which has been the case in his own life.

## Wus in Macau

Emerson and Ivy Wu and their seven pieces of luggage, much of which carried their computers and necessary supplies for their ministry, arrived safely in Hong Kong on September 5. While they await the approval of their visas to Macau, they are staying at IM's missionary apartment in Hong Kong. The apartment is within walking distance of shopping and most of the services they need, but walking is still an issue for Ivy whose corrective surgery on her foot still gives her trouble with pain and swelling. The heat and humidity are oppressive and they are thankful for the air conditioning of the apartment though the contrast of the indoor cold and outdoor heat is extreme. They go out in dry clothes and return home in wet ones.

The process of doing simple things is different, and there is much they have had to learn, such as the location and how to use the ATM for cash, the subway and bus lines, going daily to the "wet market" for fresh food, even how to turn on the stove in the apartment. The "wet market" is an outdoor market (think farmers market) and gets its name from the aisles between the rows

of produce. These aisles are really wet and require careful stepping.

Among their unexpected experiences was the typhoon that kept them inside and the businesses and transportation shut down. They were, however, grateful for the break in activity it provided. Because they are Taiwanese in China they are considered "foreign" and targets for cheating. They have learned not to trust a sign in a window

advertising a particular price; instead what they buy must have a price on it clearly marked.




