A Singing Faith

It is with great joy and anticipation that I accept the role of Worship Director at Karl Road Baptist Church. Worship is humbling ourselves and asking for forgiveness from God or someone we've hurt. **Anytime we hear the voice of the Lord and respond, it is worship.**

But let's face it--singing is a special expression of worship that God has given the Church. It has been said that Christianity is a "singing faith." And the great part is that it doesn't matter what your voice sounds like or whether or not you can perform vocal gymnastics. Steven Brooks, a Professor of Worship at Azusa Pacific University says there are four reasons why we sing:

- Singing is a Scriptural Command
- Singing Allows Us to Rehearse God's Story
- Singing Forms Us Spiritually
- Singing Has the Power to Unite

One of my goals as Worship Director is to continue to grow in my understanding and expression of worship and to pass that along to you, so that together we may worship God with all that is in us! I plan to be stretched and I hope you do, too. After all, "Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all." (*When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*)


