

Samaritans Purse

Operation Christmas Child demonstrates God's love to hurting children in a tangible way by partnering with churches worldwide to deliver gift-filled shoe boxes and the Good News of Jesus Christ. There will be an Operation Christmas Child table in the church lobby the end of October. You will be able to pick up a brochure with information on what to pack, a label for the child you



want to receive your gifts, and an envelope for your donation of **\$7** to help with shipping.


Wrap a shoebox with Christmas paper (lid separately), fill it with goodies and put a rubber band around it. If you are not good at wrapping shoeboxes, we will even provide a box for your use.

Pre-wrapped boxes will be available on the Samaritan's Purse table in the lobby. Be sure to pick up a label marked boy or girl to glue on your box.



Pack one or more shoeboxes with **SCHOOL SUPPLIES**—pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books. **TOYS**—small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch-A-Sketch, Slinky, toys that light up or make noise (include extra batteries). **HYGIENE**—toothbrush & paste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth. **OTHER**—T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries). **DO NOT INCLUDE**—Used or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food, breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers, aerosol cans. Samaritan's Purse will pack a booklet that tells the story of Jesus birth, death on the cross for our sins, and His resurrection proving He is God. As we join with thousands of Christians across America and in many other countries, through our gifts and the story of salvation, this can be the best Christmas in the lives of children around the world.

Bring the filled boxes back to church by Sunday, November 16. We will dedicate all the boxes that Sunday before sending them on their way to the children. Last year Karl Road Baptist provided 95 boxes to Samaritan's Purse.




Worship Matters' Review
