Just over two years ago Sean and Aimee Worley arrived at an apartment on the east side of Columbus, the new home of a man named Edward. He and his family had recently moved there after they lost everything in a fire in their Northland area apartment building. Since that day in 2014, the Northland Chapter of the Bed Brigade has delivered nearly 150 beds to families in need. The holiday season is always busy with bed requests and on Sunday, December 4 we completed our largest, one day delivery of 21 beds to seven different families. We had a wonderful crew to help with deliveries and set-up.
